What is Feedback?

- SPECIFIC! Use examples
- Meaningful or helpful
- Explanation of what they are doing well
- Explanation of what they need improvement on
- Encouragement to do better
- One-on-one conference to explain comments and ask questions
- Positive intention ONLY
- Always use a Post-It note to respect the other person's work
- Focused on the requirements for the writing/drawing
- What can the student do to make their paper/statement easier to understand?
- Wonderings or questions about what you are reading.

What feedback is NOT!!!

- ❖ Mean spirited (Didn't you learn to spell years ago?)
- ❖ Meant to hurt feelings (Your spelling was really bad)
- ❖ Simple statements (Good job! I liked it. Well done!)

Procedure: (all written statements should be on a Post-It note)

1. Read their piece.
2. Write what you liked about what you read on a post-it note.
3. Write down their main idea. (Word choice, use of details, organization of ideas, sentence length, topic, etc.)
4. What can they improve upon?

Sentence Stems:
